UPMC Horizon has donated automated external defibrillators to local schools, businesses, and fire and police departments.

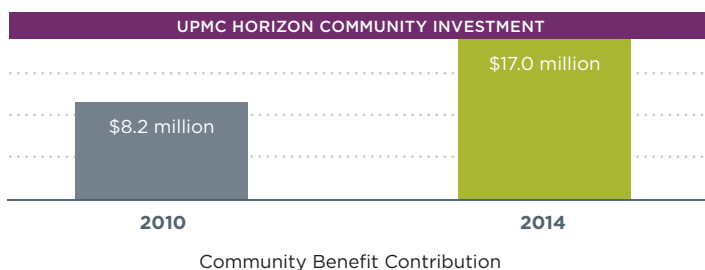
Combining Clinical Excellence and Compassionate Care

- UPMC CancerCenter at UPMC Horizon is the county's only cancer program accredited by the American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer. Care includes comprehensive medical oncology, radiation oncology, diagnosis, pathology, support, and counseling services that eliminate the need to travel to Pittsburgh.
- UPMC Horizon provides an extensive array of cardiac services to provide convenient access to care.
- Telemedicine programs developed in collaboration with Magee-Womens Hospital of UPMC and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh of UPMC allow high-risk pregnancy patients and pediatric emergency medicine patients to receive care at UPMC Horizon, eliminating the need to travel far from home.
- UPMC Horizon is the only hospital in Mercer County recognized as a Joint Commission Top Performer on Key Quality Measures, and one of the few hospitals in the nation to achieve this recognition for the past three years.

Providing Education and Employment

- UPMC Horizon provides training for physicians in family medicine, internal medicine, orthopaedic surgery, and general surgery. Many of these graduates become local doctors who give back by practicing in the community.
- UPMC Horizon is among the region's largest employers, with an economic impact to the region of \$235.5 million.

UPMC Horizon has doubled its investment in community-focused programs and services since 2010.



CREATING A HEALTHIER COMMUNITY

Promoting Health and Wellness

- Joining forces with the Community Health Partnership of Mercer County, UPMC Horizon works with area schools on health promotion projects. Participating students are rewarded with a free ticket to a Pittsburgh Pirates game.
- The hospital provides free breast cancer screenings and mammograms in conjunction with the Family Planning Service of Mercer County and the Womancare Center of UPMC Horizon. The hospital also offers free prostate cancer screening to high-risk patients.

Supporting a Full Recovery, From Hospital to Home

- Nurses reinforce the importance of medication management and home care to help each patient better understand their condition and care upon discharge.
- UPMC Horizon works with a local pharmacy to offer discharged patients a customized medication package that helps them know the right times to take medications and the correct dosage.
- A grant from the UPMC Horizon Foundation links eligible patients with St. Paul's Without Walls - Community Transitions, a program that helps recently discharged patients with obtaining rides home, medications, and groceries.

UPMC Horizon's community-wide Comprehensive Health Fair offers free screenings for cancer, heart disease, and diabetes.



Through a partnership between the Medical Equipment Recycling Program and the UPMC Horizon Foundation, lower income Mercer County area residents may receive refurbished wheelchairs, canes, and walkers.
