- UPMC is ranked in the nation's top 10 by *U.S. News & World Report* for Ear, Nose, and Throat, Gastroenterology and GI surgery, Pulmonology, and Rheumatology.
- UPMC Presbyterian is a designated Level I Regional Resource Trauma Center — the busiest trauma center in Pennsylvania — and was awarded Comprehensive Stroke Center Certification by the Joint Commission and the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association for its ability to assess and treat the most complex stroke cases.
- UPMC continues to provide hope to patients with organ failure. This past year, UPMC Presbyterian surgeons performed 390 organ transplants.
- The hospital provides nationally recognized, high-quality comprehensive cardiac care. The hospital received top rankings from the Society of Thoracic Surgeons in 2013.

Promoting the Economic Well-Being of Pittsburgh

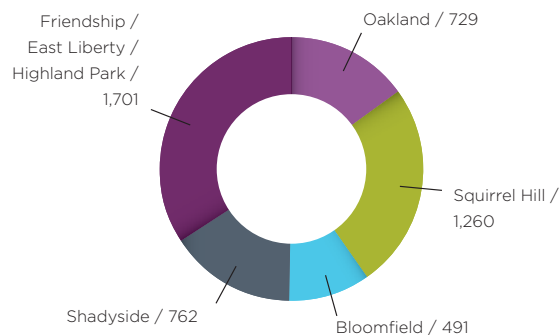
- UPMC brings thousands of residents and fellows to Pittsburgh to continue their educations in the health sciences. In 2013, UPMC was the second largest medical training program in the United States with over 1,400 residents.

(NIH) funding, UPMC supports the latest developments in patient treatment and care. This past year, more than \$457 million in NIH grants supported Pittsburgh researchers to help fund innovative biomedical research.

Reaching Out to Support the Community

- UPMC actively supports initiatives to improve the Oakland neighborhood, including *Oakland Forever*, which celebrates Oakland's 175th anniversary, *Oakland 2025*, a strategic plan for Oakland, *Innovation Oakland* that plans to bring smart technology and art into public spaces throughout Oakland, and the Bates Street beautification initiative.
- The hospital provides support to many local community service organizations in the Oakland neighborhood, such as Community Human Services, People's Oakland, Oakland Planning and Development, Hill House, and many others.
- UPMC Presbyterian provided shuttle service to the Friendship House Tour this past year.

Helping People Stay Healthy and Out of the Hospital

- UPMC Presbyterian, in partnership with UPMC Shadyside, works with the Urban League Charter School to promote exercise programs and healthy eating among the school's students and their families.
- Through the ED Pharmacy Project, UPMC Presbyterian opened a new, convenient Outpatient Retail Pharmacy next to the hospital's Emergency Department. Eligible individuals can easily obtain free or reduced-price antibiotics prior to being discharged from the hospital.
- UPMC's Matilda Theiss Health Center, a Federally Qualified Health Center located in Pittsburgh's Oak Hill neighborhood, provides comprehensive primary and preventive care in a patient-centered medical home setting that focuses on the individual needs of each patient.

UPMC Presbyterian was instrumental in the development of Crossroads Park, a green space adjacent to the hospital. Members of the hospital engineering and maintenance staff handle the majority of park maintenance.



UPMC Presbyterian employees serve on many local boards, such as the Urban League of Greater Pittsburgh Charter School, Family House, POWER (Pennsylvania Organization for Women in Recovery), and the Oakland Business Improvement District.
