


UPMC ST. MARGARET CARING FOR THE COMMUNITY

- The UPMC CancerCenter at UPMC St. Margaret is recognized for its quality care to cancer patients by the Commission on Cancer. Other specialties include bariatrics, orthopaedics, and lung and thoracic diseases.


Providing Comprehensive Care to the Whole Family—From Children to Seniors

- The UPMC St. Margaret Family Health Centers, located in Lawrenceville, Bloomfield-Garfield, and New Kensington, deliver primary and preventive care to families.
- The hospital has a long-standing commitment to providing family-centered care, from children to seniors. The hospital's family residency program was established in 1971, and many graduates maintain practices in the Pittsburgh area.
- The hospital's Geriatric Fellowship Program is one of only a select few in the country to train providers in caring for seniors. UPMC St. Margaret Geriatric Care Centers are evaluation and treatment facilities designed to meet the health needs of people over age 60.

Focusing on Senior Health

- Working with the St. Margaret Foundation and North Hills Community Outreach, the Free Rides for Seniors van takes seniors to doctor's offices and other locations in the Blawnox and Sharpsburg areas.
- The hospital provides stroke risk and fall prevention programs, as well as depression screenings, at senior community centers and local churches.

Reaching Out to Support the Community

- UPMC St. Margaret hosts community flu shot clinics, skin cancer screenings, and Alive & Well health seminars featuring physicians and other health care professionals.
- The hospital hosts health education programs on COPD, congestive heart failure, and palliative care for health care professionals at skilled nursing and assisted living facilities.
- Through a strong commitment from the St. Margaret Foundation, the Bed Fund helps uninsured and underinsured patients with transportation, and discounts on prescriptions, medical supplies, and equipment.

The Living-At-Home program offers seniors help in living independently as long as possible by coordinating services such as home-delivered meals, grocery shopping, and housekeeping.





LISTENING TO THE COMMUNITY AND ADDRESSING ITS NEEDS:



In 2013, UPMC St. Margaret conducted a Community Health Needs Assessment which brought together community leaders and public health experts to discuss and identify local health needs. The assessment showed that **senior health and caring for the aging population, preventive health and wellness, preventive screenings, and end-of-life care** are important health topics for UPMC St. Margaret to focus on over the next three years.
