Certified Clinical Perfusionist	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Graduate of an approved school of Clinical Perfusion.</li> <li>2. Equivalent, acceptable On The Job Training and American Board of Cardiovascular Perfusion (ABCP) certification.</li> <li>3. Current certification from the ABCP, or, if a recent program graduate, must be eligible for ABCP certification within two years.</li> <li>4. Current licensure in the State of Pennsylvania as a Perfusionist.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Completed application &amp; Delineation of Clinical Functions form submitted by Supervising Physician.</li> <li>2. Three (3) references providing evidence of acceptable clinical experience.</li> <li>3. Completion of clinical interview with Admin. Dir./Designee of Dept. of Perfusion Services.</li> <li>4. Provisional period of one (1) year is required. Written evaluation must be completed at the end of the provisional period by appropriate Dept. Director/ Designee indicating that the certified Perfusionist has demonstrated appropriate skills to carry out the clinical functions as stated. The provisional period may be extended for an additional six (6) months as deemed necessary by the appropriate Medical Staff Department.</li> <li>5. Periodic review will be done every two (2) years.</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Agree to abide by Pennsylvania Code 136.14.</li> <li>2. Evidence of Liability Insurance.</li> <li>3. Agree to abide by appropriate written Department/ Hospital/ Medical Staff Policies and Bylaws.</li> <li>4. Documentation of certification submitted to Medical Staff Office on annual basis.</li> <li>5. Signed statement of overall responsibility by Supervising Physician.</li> <li>6.
