

Charity Care and Unreimbursed Medicaid Costs \$509 Million



Handling the Dramatic Surge in COVID-19 Patient Volume

In December 2020, COVID-19 patient volumes peaked across Pennsylvania and in UPMC medical facilities. We quickly redeployed hundreds of nurses and expanded critical care bed capacity—affirming our ability to meet the rising demand and maintain our leading-edge medical and surgical treatments. Telemedicine connected UPMC's critical care specialists with providers hundreds of miles away—extending the reach of UPMC resources.



Working Together with the University of Pittsburgh

- Our virology team was among the first to develop an in-house COVID-19 diagnostic test to overcome limited testing capabilities. Used throughout our service areas with our own 3-D printed swabs, the test tracked disease prevalence.
- We deployed our REMAP adaptive clinical trial platform to identify common, inexpensive steroids as the most effective therapy for severe COVID-19, helping to define treatment protocols worldwide. Adaptive clinical trials allow for "learning while doing" and position UPMC to determine what treatments help COVID-19 patients best.
- We developed an antibody to treat and prevent the virus, which holds potential to help seniors and the immunocompromised.
- We are using an adaptive platform to compare monoclonal antibody treatments and determining in real time which treatment works best.





Acting as Our Own Venture Capitalist

UPMC Enterprises advances commercialization opportunities for both breakthrough science and digital solutions, and uses the UPMC organization as a laboratory for turning innovative ideas into thriving businesses.

In January 2020, UPMC Enterprises announced plans to deploy \$1 billion to develop new drugs, diagnostics, and devices by 2024. The commitment includes \$200 million that has funded an immunotherapy-focused partnership with the University of Pittsburgh. UPMC Enterprises will seek investments and partners globally that complement the scientific and commercial work already underway in Pittsburgh, and our expanded areas of focus in retinal and respiratory diseases, autoimmune diseases, neuroinflammation, and other therapeutic areas.





Advancing the Immune Transplant and Therapy Center

The Immune Transplant and Therapy Center (ITTC) serves as a discovery incubator to move ahead revolutionary science in the areas of cancer and autoimmune diseases, drug discovery, and antibody development targeted at SARS-CoV-2 related diseases. The Center currently has funded

46 projects.

Forging Ahead with Excellence

UPMC entered the new decade positioned as the region's leading provider and insurer. From this unique perspective, UPMC brings a wide range of specialized services and care closer to home.



Growing to Support the Community

Over the past year, UPMC made significant progress on new, state-of-the-art facilities and services, which will help us care for our communities for years to come.

- Construction is progressing on the UPMC Vision and Rehabilitation Hospital at UPMC Mercy, the first of three new specialty hospitals in Pittsburgh. The new facility positions UPMC as a global leader in rehabilitation and ophthalmic research and care.
- Opened the new UPMC West Mifflin Outpatient Center, bringing more than 20 patient-centered services to the Route 51 corridor south of Pittsburgh.
- Significant enhancements were made to facilities throughout Pennsylvania by introducing children's and women's services in new locations and expanding diagnostic capabilities and emergency facilities.
- Opened UPMC Hamot's new \$111 million, five-story, 200,000 square-foot building.



Bringing Exceptional Care to Central Pennsylvania

In 2020, UPMC West Shore opened its newly expanded Emergency Department, UPMC Children's Harrisburg introduced nationally ranked care from UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh to central Pennsylvania, and UPMC Hillman Cancer Center extended its services to north central Pennsylvania.

Expanding Our Network to Western Maryland

In 2020, Western Maryland Health System became UPMC Western Maryland. To ensure a future of high-quality care for communities in the region, we committed to a five-year, \$90 million investment to enhance services and facilities.





Extending UPMC's Care Internationally

UPMC's international footprint is among the largest of any U.S.-based academic medical center. Despite the challenges of the COVID-19 pandemic, we continue to strengthen positions in our four countries of focus, allowing UPMC to give back to the communities we serve.

CHINA:

We broke ground on the 500-bed Wanda-UPMC Chengdu Hospital to be managed by UPMC.

ITALY:

Construction began on the Biomedical Research and Biotechnology Center. Managed by UPMC, the facility will focus on drug, vaccine, and biomedical device development.

IRELAND:

We opened the UPMC Sports Medicine Clinic in Waterford, and acquired Aut Even Hospital in Kilkenny.

KAZAKHSTAN:

UPMC is helping to develop the first integrated academic medical center in Kazakhstan.





At the crossroads of **Quality and COSt**, the UPMC Insurance Services' Center for High-Value Health Care evaluates new paradigms to improve health outcomes.

In 2020, the Center funded projects to:

- Target capacity expansion of medication-assisted treatment for prescription drug and opioid addiction
- Launch Freedom House 2.0 to train displaced workers as Emergency Medical Technicians

The Strength of Our Diversified Business Model

UPMC Insurance Services covers more than 4 million lives statewide and nationally, and continues to serve our area's most vulnerable populations.

- Employer-Sponsored and Individual Plans—UPMC Health Plan grew to achieve the largest commercial individual market share in western Pennsylvania.
- Medicare Advantage—UPMC for Life remains the largest insurer in western Pennsylvania and ranks 11th in the nation based on premiums.
- Medicaid UPMC for You, among the largest Medicaid managed care plans in Pennsylvania, experienced unprecedented membership growth, and will begin providing services statewide in 2022.
- Community Care Behavioral Health—Serving 41 counties in Pennsylvania, UPMC owns the largest Medicaid behavioral health company in the state.
- Children's Health Insurance Program—UPMC for Kids is Pennsylvania's largest insurer for children and has expanded to 16 additional counties across the commonwealth.

Capital Expenditures

 WorkPartners – Expansion continued on the diverse range of WorkPartners products and services that manage benefits for more than 700,000 members in 48 states.

Implementing Community HealthChoices Statewide

In 2020, UPMC expanded its **Community HealthChoices** program to all five Pennsylvania zones, serving dually eligible Medicaid and Medicare individuals, including those in nursing facilities or receiving home and community-based services.








Continued Reinvesting in Community-Focused Programs and Services


