

**Delineation of Privileges Request
Criteria Summary Sheet**

Specialty: ANESTHESIOLOGY

KNOWLEDGE	Successful Completion of an ACGME/AOA, accredited program
TRAINING	The successful completion of an approved (ACGME/AOA) residency training program in Anesthesiology
CERTIFICATION	Graduates of an ACGME approved Anesthesiology training program, must be board certified/eligible by the American Board of Anesthesiology (AOA). Only graduates of an AOA-approved anesthesiology residency training program may be board certified by the American Osteopathic Board of Anesthesiology. Diplomats certified by the American Board of Anesthesiology after January 1, 2000 and Diplomats with the subspecialty certification in Critical Care Medicine after 2001 must maintain board certification by the American Board of Anesthesiology through recertification every ten years. Diplomats who hold a certificate that is not time-limited may voluntarily participate in the evaluation process of recertification.
OTHER	<p>Applicant must be able to demonstrate that he/she has provided anesthetic management for at least 500 inpatient or outpatient surgical procedures during the past 24 months or has provided substantial management of 100 critical care patients or 100 patients with chronic pain problems.</p> <p><u>Cardiovascular Anesthesia:</u></p> <p>The applicant must complete an approved fellowship in Cardiovascular Anesthesia or must have clinical experience in providing anesthesia for cardiovascular cases which is satisfactory to the Chairperson.</p> <p><u>Transesophageal Echocardiography:</u></p> <p>The applicant must qualify for privileges in the Division of Cardiovascular Anesthesia, and must document specific training in Transesophageal Echocardiography to include 100 examinations under supervision, as well as attendance at a training course in Transesophageal Echocardiography.</p> <p><u>Division of Pain Management:</u></p> <p>The applicant must complete an approved fellowship in Pain Management</p> <p><u>Other Subspecialty Divisions:</u></p> <p>The applicant for privileges in other subspecialty divisions must have fellowship training or clinical experience in the area for which privileges are requested which is satisfactory to the chairperson.</p>
