The tuition rate for the Fall 2019 and Spring 2020 are an estimate only.

*A credit hour is a unit of measure, not necessarily an indicator of transferability of credit. The receiving institute, rather than the training institution, decides whether to accept credits for transfer.

Westminster utilizes a semester hour as a standard unit of credit. A 4 semester hour course delivers 45 hours of instruction per semester. All science courses have an additional 45 hours of lab per semester.

Students requesting transfer of credit for the science courses (Anatomy and Physiology I & II and Microbiology) must have the equivalent of 4 credits with one being a lab. Students requesting transfer of credit for Growth and Development, College Writing and Biomedical Ethics must have the equivalent of a 3 credit course (45 contact hours). Students will be awarded 3 semester hours instead of credits.

72 credits are required to graduate from the program. Students awarded transfer of credit for Growth and Development, College Writing and Biomedical Ethics may graduate with a minimum of 69 credits.
