Caring for grieving children, teens,
and families.

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When children and teens experience the death of a loved one, they can become overwhelmed by their emotions, have many questions, and feel alone.

Spending time with others who have experienced a death can provide a safe place for talking about or learning ways to express feelings and to see that these feelings are a normal part of grieving.

About the Program

At Heartworks, specially trained facilitators help children and teens cope with the loss of a loved one through art, play, music, discussion, and remembering.

Adult family members also have a place to express their feelings and learn to understand better what their child is experiencing. Many times, lines of communication between a family and child open up where there had been little communication before.

The Heartworks support group provides a safe place to express feelings and develop healthy coping skills that can restore a sense of control and hope for the future.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who can benefit from Heartworks?

The Heartworks program at Family Hospice provides age-appropriate grief support groups for children and teens (ages four to 18) and their parents or guardians.

When do support groups meet?

Groups meet twice a month, September through May. A light meal is served from 6 to 6:30 p.m., followed by the group meeting from 6:30 to 7:30 p.m.

How much does it cost?
